The Bhoys play over 200 shows a year, regionally as well as all across the United States and Ireland.

Have released five albums and have sold thousands of CDs.

Have headlined two tours of Ireland in 2010-11, bringing nearly 100 fans with them.

Their album *Irish In America* was ranked #10 on Paddyrock.com's list of the Top Celtic Rock and Punk CDs for 2007, along such acts as the Young Dubliners, The Dropkick Murphys and the Tossers.

Their album *Live... What's It To Ya?!* was ranked #12 on Paddyrock.com's list of the Top Celtic Rock and Punk CDs for 2009, despite a mid-November release.

Adam and Geno were nominated as "Best Duo in a Pub, Concert or Festival" by the Irish Music Association of Kansas City. They won the popular vote.

The Bhoys sang the National Anthem at St. Paul's Xcel Center Arena.

Have made numerous television and radio appearances in the Twin Cities, including a 20-minute live in studio performance/interview on Cities 97, 97.1FM and several spots on Twin Cities' NBC affiliate TV station KARE-11.

Were featured performers at "Irish Night" at Midway Stadium, home of the St. Paul Saints Baseball Club.

Often give their time performing for no fee at various charity events, including the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society, Minnesota chapter of the MS Society, St. Baldrick's Childrens Cancer Fund, Camp Heartland, The Emerald Society of Minnesota, and a variety of private fundraising events.

Have been featured performers at fundraising events for US Senator Amy Klobuchar and St. Paul Mayor Chris Coleman.
